2008 DAV TRANSPORTATION NETWORK VAN GRANT PROGRAM

The 2008 DAV Transportation Network (TN) Van Grant Program van approval letters have been sent to all DAV Departments participating in this year's program.

Delivery is expected this spring. When the vehicles are available, we will request VA Central Office to provide instructions to the VAMC director for pick up by DAV VAVS volunteers at VA's expense.

Payment for the vehicles are now required. Grants for the 2008 Vehicle Grant Program are processed through The Colorado Trust, which is administered by the DAV National Service Foundation. DAV HOSPITAL SERVICE COORDINATOR/ TRANSPORTATION NETWORK PROGRAM

The DAV Hospital Service Coordinator/Transportation Network Program (HSC/TN) celebrates 21 successful years. The HSC/TN was established in 1987 and has seen phenomenal growth in all areas of operation. It has become an indispensable program to thousands of veterans needing transportation for their much needed care at VA medical facilities.

Developed in cooperation with the VA, the DAV TN was intended to operate as a fully integrated service within each VA medical facility. In accomplishing this, full-time DAV Hospital Service Coordinators were placed at each of the VA's 172 hospitals. Assisting the Hospital Services Coordinators is a corps of thousands of DAV VAVS volunteers.

In January 1987, there were three such programs. By the end of that year, there were 109. The number of veterans transported and the number of miles driven have increased steadily since then. Many of these veterans rode in vans the DAV donated to VA medical facilities for use in the DAV TN. DAV Departments and Chapters, together with the National Organization, have now donated 1,959 vans to VA medical facilities nationwide at a cost of \$39,782,133. The table below clearly shows the expansion of service within this program.

NATIONAL SALUTE TO HOSPITALIZED VETERANS

2008 National Salute Chairman -- Mike Vogel "Discretion is being able to raise your eyebrow instead of your voice." -Unknown

Actor Mike Vogel led VA's annual patient recognition program where the public was invited to visit and honor hospitalized veterans during National Salute Week, February 10-16, 2008. He will serve as national spokesperson for more than 90,000 volunteers serving veterans at VA facilities across the nation. The youngest celebrity to lead the National Salute, Mike Vogel brings youthful energy to the program at a time when the number of young combat

veterans under VA care is growing and VA is looking to younger generations of American's to replenish an aging volunteer force.

Mr. Vogel was born in Abington, Pennsylvania in 1979 and began modeling for Levi-Strauss & Company shortly after high school. He began his acting career in 2001 on the Fox Network television series "Grounded for Life." He has appeared in a variety of movies since, including "The Sisterhood of the Traveling Pants," "Rumor has It," and "Poseidon," the 2006 remake of the "Poseidon Adventure." Currently, Mike has a starring role in the new feature film "Cloverfield," released in January 2008. He became personally involved in supporting veterans after his cousin's husband was killed during military duty in Iraq in 2007. Both of his grandfathers fought in World War II. One was a tank commander and veteran of the Battle of the Bulge; the other a Seabee in the Navy.

The purpose of the National Salute to Hospitalized Veterans Program is to pay tribute and express appreciation to hospitalized veterans; increase community awareness of the role of the VA medical center; encourage citizens to visit hospitalized veterans and to become involved as volunteers.

The week of February 14 each year is your opportunity to say thank you to a special group of men and women, more than 98,000 veterans of the U.S. armed services who are cared for every day in Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) medical centers, outpatient clinics, domiciliaries, and nursing homes.

During the National Salute, VA invites individuals, veterans groups, military personnel, civic organizations, businesses, schools, local media, celebrities and sports stars to participate in a variety of activities at the VA medical centers. The activities and events include special ward visits and valentine distributions; photo opportunities; school essay contests; special recreation activities and veteran recognition programs. The week provides an opportunity for the community to become acquainted with the volunteer opportunities within the medical center.
